

ಮೇಲ್ಕಂಡ ವಿಷಯ ಮತ್ತು ಉಲ್ಲೇಖಕ್ಕೆ ಸಂಬಂಧಿಸಿದಂತೆ ರಾಷ್ಟ್ರೀಯ ಸೇವಾ ಯೋಜನೆಯಲ್ಲಿ ಸಕ್ರಿಯವಾಗಿ ಪಾಲ್ಗೊಂಡು ಅತ್ಯುತ್ತಮ ಸೇವೆಯನ್ನು ಮಾಡಿರುವಂತಹ ಎನ್ ಎಸ್ ಎಸ್ ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿ/ವಿದ್ಯಾರ್ಥಿನಿಯರಿಗೆ 2015-16 ನೇ ಸಾಲಿನ ಅತ್ಯುತ್ತಮ ಸ್ವಯಂಸೇವಕರ ಪ್ರಶಸ್ತಿಗಳನ್ನು ವಿತರಿಸಲು ರಾಷ್ಟ್ರೀಯ ಯುವನಾಯಕತ್ವ ಕಾರ್ಯಕ್ರಮವನ್ನು ಹಮ್ಮಿಕೊಳ್ಳಲಾಗಿದೆ. ಅತ್ಯುತ್ತಮ ಸ್ವಯಂಸೇವಕರ ಪ್ರಶಸ್ತಿಗಾಗಿ ಪ್ರಸ್ತಾವನೆಗಳನ್ನು ಕಳುಹಿಸುವಾಗ ಈ ಕೆಳಕಂಡ ಅಂಶಗಳನ್ನು ಪರಿಗಣಿಸಿ ಕಳುಹಿಸಿಕೊಡಲು ಸೂಚಿಸಲಾಗಿದೆ.

ನಿಯಮಗಳು :

1. ಒಂದು ವರ್ಷದಲ್ಲ ಕನಿಷ್ಠ 120 ಗಂಟೆಗಳು ದೈನಂದಿನ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಪಾಲ್ಗೊಂಡಿರಬೇಕು.
2. ಒಂದು ವರ್ಷದಲ್ಲ 100 ಗಂಟೆಗಳು ಹೆಚ್ಚುವರಿಯಾಗಿ (ಒಂದು ವರ್ಷದಲ್ಲ ಕನಿಷ್ಠ 120 ಗಂಟೆಗಳನ್ನು ಹೊರತುಪಡಿಸಿ) ದೈನಂದಿನ ಚಟುವಟಿಕೆಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಪಾಲ್ಗೊಂಡಿರಬೇಕು.
3. ಎನ್ ಎಸ್ ಎಸ್ ನಲ್ಲಿ ವಿಶೇಷವಾಗಿ ಗಮನಸೆಳೆಯುವಂತಹ ಕಾರ್ಯಕ್ರಮಗಳಲ್ಲಿ ಪಾಲ್ಗೊಂಡಿರಬೇಕು.
4. ಪ್ರಸ್ತಾವನೆಗಳನ್ನು ವರದಿ, ಫೋಟೋ, ಇತರೆ ಸಮೂಹಗಳೊಂದಿಗೆ ದಿನಾಂಕ 15/12/2016 ರೊಳಗೆ ಕೇಂದ್ರೀಯ ಕಛೇರಿಯ ಎನ್ ಎಸ್ ಎಸ್ ವಿಭಾಗಕ್ಕೆ ಮುದ್ದಾಂ ಅಥವಾ ನೋಂದಾಯಿತ ಅಂಚೆಯ ಮೂಲಕ ತಲುಪಿಸುವುದು. ತದ ನಂತರ ಬರುವ ಪ್ರಸ್ತಾವನೆಗಳನ್ನು ಪರಿಗಣಿಸಲಾಗುವುದಿಲ್ಲ.



Sir/Madam,

As you are aware that NSS has to undertake minimum of 100 hrs of Shramdan in a year in addition to 120 hrs which every NSS volunteer has to complete under regular activities. To encourage NSS volunteers who have rendered additional 100 hrs. in shramdan activities, Ministry has decided to give the awards to the NSS units. The guidelines are enclosed for your information with a request to circulate this guidelines to all the concerned universities/+2 councils so that the awards are finalised for the year 2015-2016 as per guidelines.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

GUIDELINES FOR AWARDS UNDER NATIONAL YOUNG LEADERS PROGRAMME (NYLP)

The National Service Scheme (NSS) is one of the largest Government organisations of student youth in the country. The strength of the student volunteers is around 36 lakhs which makes the NSS one of the largest student forces in the world. NSS covers all States and Union Territories.

The objective of the programme is to understand the community in which the student's work and understand themselves in relation to the community. Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility. Identify the needs and problems of the community and find the practical solutions of the same. The NSS Volunteer has to be a volunteer for two years during which he/she puts in 120 hrs. of regular activity during a year and attends one special camp (Day/Night) of seven days duration.

The objective of the programme is to channelize the immense youth energy towards the Nation building. The same will be achieved by involving the youth in large scale Shramdaan (voluntary labour) all over the country. This will develop the personality and leadership qualities of the youth and promote the spirit of dignity of labour.

NATURE OF ACTIVITIES TO BE TAKEN UP UNDER THE PROGRAMME

Under the Shramdaan programme any activity that involve voluntary labour and is useful to the local area/adopted village/slum or community can be taken up. An illustrative list is as follows:-

- a) Digging, maintenance, disinfection, de-silting, de-weeding and repair of water bodies, cleaning and de-weeding of Rivers, Lakes, Tals, Boulds, Tanks, Wells etc.
- b) Removal of Parthenium (Gaajar Ghas), Lantana and Water Hyacinth (these plants are a threat to the environment and water bodies; Parthenium (Gaajar Ghas) is also a health hazard).
- c) Constructions of water tanks/ Ponds ground water recharging purpose.
- d) Plantation of saplings to stop soil erosion, development of village pasturelands, re-cooping of bunjar/unfertile lands.
- e) Cleaning and repair of village drainage system disposal of garbage in order to generate environment friendly manure.
- f) Cleaning of village streets and open spaces, collection and disposal of polythene bags and plastic waste for disposal.
- g) Constructions/repair of village roads, small connecting bridges and small water harvesting bodies.

- h) Cleaning, white-washing, painting, repair/maintenance of school buildings, gram panchayats, primary health centres, anganwadi's, Places of worship and other public buildings.
- i) Development and maintenance of play ground, cleaning of schools, college campus etc.
- j) Assisting in constructions of soak-pits, for the needy people maintenance of school/community toilets etc.
- k) Preservation/cleaning/maintenance of heritage sites.

Cleanliness activities under Swachh Bharat Mission will be special area of focus as far as activities under this programme are concerned.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY

The Programme shall be implemented through National Service Scheme volunteers enrolled under this scheme. The scheme shall be implemented through NSS in all States and UTs through universities, colleges and +2 Schools covered under NSS.

IMPLEMENTATION STRATEGY AND ACTIVITIES

The Programme will be implemented purely on voluntary basis which will be undertaken by universities and its affiliated colleges, medical/nursing/engineering institutes and +2 Schools in adopted villages, Adarsh-Gram, slums etc. Activities will be undertaken with local initiative by engaging local NSS volunteers so that the cost of the activity would be reduced but save time and money which a volunteer would need to spend on their travel, boarding and lodging.

Each NSS Unit having adopted village would undertake minimum of 100 hrs of Shramdaan in a year. It could be either 2-3 hrs on a non-working day (i.e. Saturday/Sunday) or during lean working days or holidays.

The duration of the Shramdaan may be more during a given day but should not be less than two hrs a day.

PARTICIPATION AND NUMBER

In each programme a minimum of fifty to hundred NSS volunteers would participate to work on pre-identified projects.

AWARDS

Since the scheme will operate on unit level the competition begins at the university level and its affiliated Colleges and +2 Schools. Therefore, the awards need to be given first at the university level and at the Directorate/+2 council level. The awards would constitute with a certificate and a cash prize to those NSS Units who have successfully completed 100 hrs of Shramdaan.

University and Directorate/+2 Council having less than 10 NSS units would not be considered for award.

In each university and Directorate/+2 council, the awards would be given away as follows -

University/+2 Council having the following units will be considered for award:

- A) Units 10-19 One award (i) Rs. 25,000/- (1st prize) Cash Prize & certificate
- B) Units 20-49 Two awards (i) Rs. 30,000/- (1st prize) Cash Prize & certificate
(ii) Rs. 25,000/- (2nd prize) Cash prize & Certificate
- C) Units 50-99 Three awards (i) Rs. 35,000/- (1st prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(ii) Rs. 30,000/- (2nd prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(iii) Rs. 25,000/- (3rd prize) Cash prize & certificate
- D) Units 100 & 199 Four awards (i) Rs. 40,000/- (1st prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(ii) Rs. 35,000/- (2nd prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(iii) Rs. 30,000/- (3rd prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(iv) Rs. 25,000/- (4th prize) Cash prize & Certificate
- E) Units 200 & above Five awards (i) Rs. 50,000/- (1st prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(ii) Rs. 40,000/- (2nd prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(iii) Rs. 35,000/- (3rd prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(iv) Rs. 30,000/- (4th prize) Cash prize & Certificate
(v) Rs. 25,000/- (5th prize) Cash prize & Certificate
- Funds for publicity (i) Rs. 40,000/- per programme

Publicity of activities would be required, therefore, the funds are placed for the purpose at the university/+2 council levels. At the time of awards function eminent social worker may be invited to deliver a lecture so that NSS volunteers, Programme Coordinators and Programme Officers etc. are encouraged

- ii) Directorate/+2 Council

 - iii) Programme Coordinator, NSS/ Officer dealing with NSS at Directorate/+2 Council Member Secretary

The awards would be given during a function at the university and Directorate/+2 council level with participation of senior officials, dignitaries and those who have provided the support.

The universities and the Directorates/+2 councils would utilize the award money in community development projects and for developing infrastructure at the university and Directorate/+2 council levels.

The total amount of money to be spent on awards would work out to be evaluation of the programme and identification of the best NSS Unit for conferring the awards at University and Directorate/+2 council level will be done on a financial calendar basis.

University and Directorate/+2 council who have completed 100 hours in shramdan activities will only be eligible for awards. However, the awards may be decided on the basis of more hours of shramdan activities covered by the universities and Directorates/+2 councils.
